DRESS & HAIR STANDARDS

Santa Clara has traditionally set very high standards, including personal standards of presentation for its students. I am asking for your cooperation and support in maintaining these standards.

- No student is permitted to have a colour put into his or her hair. This includes streaks.
- Boys are required to have short hair above the collar and behind the ears - short back and sides.
- Girls with long hair must have it tied back with ribbons or headbands being in school colours only.
- Only one earring per ear and only studs or sleepers are permitted in gold or silver.
- Nail polish is also not permitted to be worn.

A Message from the Director of Catholic Education WA

State Parliament passed the new Criminal Law Amendment (Intimate Images) Bill yesterday, making it illegal to distribute an intimate image of a person without consent.

In the case of someone under 16, the law says they cannot legally consent to an image of themselves being shared. The law aims to strike a balance between protecting young people from this harmful behaviour, and not unduly criminalising them.

The new intimate image laws will come into effect following the commencement of the *Criminal Law Amendment (Intimate Images) Act 2018* (WA) on 15 April 2019.

As young people under the age of 16 are not exempt from this new offence, it is imperative that information regarding these new laws is shared with our students and their parents.

The key messages for young people are:

- It is against the law to take, keep, send or ask for an intimate image of a person under the age of 18
- It is against the law to share an intimate image of a person of any age without their consent.


The Department of Justice has provided all education providers in Western Australia with <u>FAQs</u>. Legal Aid can provide free legal education sessions and resources for young people between 10 and 18 years old. Please see the school for more information if you are interested in these sessions.

With the increasing use of digital technology and social media it is important that we continue to ensure that our schools and colleges are safe places of learning and development for all our students.

Child safety requires a consolidated approach from teachers, parents, friends and the community and I encourage you to pass on information regarding these laws to your students, staff and parents.



Immunisation Reminder from the Community Health Nurse

The West Australian Immunisation Schedule recommends that children who have turned 4 years of age have the following booster immunisations:

- DTPa-IPV Vaccine against Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis (Whooping Cough) and Polio
- All other WA schedule vaccinations recommended and completed including MMRx2 (Measles, Mumps, Rubella)

Your child should have these immunisations as soon as they have turned 4.

If you need more information about these vaccines, please phone one of the following:

- Local Immunisation Clinic on (08) 6151 1308
- Central Immunisation Clinic in Perth on (08) 9321 1312
- Australian Immunisation Register on 1800 653 809 or www.humanservices.gov.au
- Your Community Health Nurse on (08) 9258 8053

At school enrolment, the parent/guardian is required to provide the immunisation status of their child .The only acceptable documentation for this purpose is the **child's Immunisation History Statement** from the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR). The date of the statement should be within the two months prior to enrolment.

A child's current AIR Immunisation History Statement can be accessed at any time by the parent/guardian through:

- MyGov, by logging in to their Medicare online account
- Medicare Express Plus App, by logging in to the Medicare account
- Visiting a Medicare or Centrelink office or
- Calling the AIR General Enquiries Line on 1800 653 809 for the Statement to be posted

Overseas immunisation records must not be accepted directly and must be verified by an Australian immunisation provider.
